What-structure

Structure:

What + (a/an) + adjective + noun!

Example:

What a fantastic idea!

This pattern emphasizes a noun phrase.

How-structure



Structure:

How + adjective/adverb + subject + verb!

Example:

How beautiful the city looks at night!

This structure emphasizes the quality or degree of something.

#### 4. Emotional Intonation in Spoken Language

In spoken English, exclamatory sentences are often distinguished by a specific intonation pattern. Speakers typically use a higher pitch or stronger stress to emphasize emotional meaning.

For example:

That movie was incredible!

The emotional tone of voice makes the sentence exclamatory even if the grammatical structure resembles a declarative sentence.

#### Classification of Exclamatory Sentences

Based on structural and functional analysis, exclamatory sentences can be divided into several categories.

##### 1. What-Exclamatory Sentences

These sentences begin with the word “what” and emphasize a noun phrase.

Structure:

What + (a/an) + adjective + noun + subject + verb!

Examples:

##### 2. How-Exclamatory Sentences

These sentences begin with the word “how” and emphasize adjectives or adverbs.

Structure:

How + adjective/adverb + subject + verb!

Examples:

How quickly the time passed!

This type expresses strong emotional reactions related to degree or intensity.

##### 3. Interjectional Exclamations

Interjectional exclamations contain words that directly express emotions. Interjections are independent expressions such as wow, oh, ah, alas, or hey.

Examples:



Wow! That's incredible!

Oh! I didn't know that!

Alas! The opportunity is lost!

Interjections are commonly used in spoken language and informal writing.

#### 4. Emotional Declarative Sentences

Some declarative sentences become exclamatory when used with strong emotional emphasis and an exclamation mark.

Examples:

I can't believe it!

This is the best day of my life!

You did a fantastic job!

Although their structure resembles declarative sentences, their emotional tone makes them exclamatory.

#### 5. Elliptical Exclamatory Sentences

Elliptical exclamations are shortened sentences where some elements are omitted but the emotional meaning remains clear.

Examples:

Amazing!

Incredible!

Fantastic!

These forms are common in informal speech and conversational language.

The findings of this study show that exclamatory sentences play a significant role in expressive communication. Unlike neutral declarative sentences, exclamatory constructions convey emotional intensity and personal attitudes.

From a syntactic perspective, exclamatory sentences demonstrate unique grammatical patterns that distinguish them from other sentence types. The use of "what" and "how" structures represents a clear syntactic marker of exclamatory meaning. These patterns are widely recognized in English grammar and are frequently taught in language learning contexts.

In addition to their grammatical structure, exclamatory sentences are closely connected with pragmatic functions. They allow speakers to evaluate situations, express surprise, admiration, or dissatisfaction, and emphasize important information. Therefore, they serve not only grammatical but also communicative purposes.
